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Demographic Profile

The population in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time* was 88,382 per American Community Survey data for 2014-2018.

The region has a civilian labor force of 36,402 with a participation rate of 53.1%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time*, 16.8% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 32.9% in the nation.

The median household income in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time* is \$30,571 and the median house value is \$72,570.

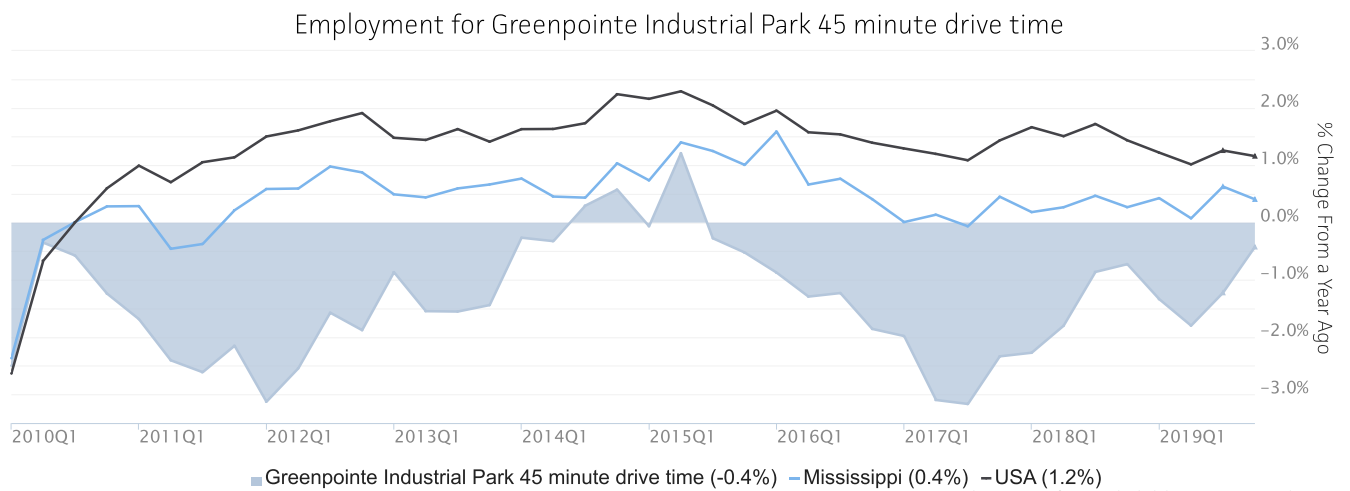

Employment Trends

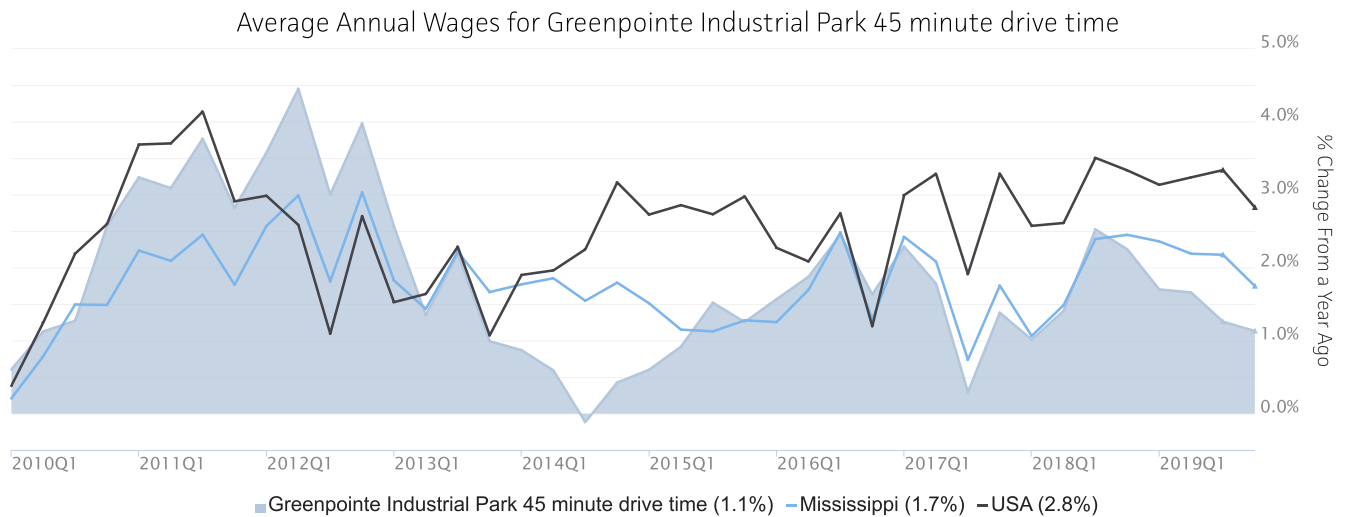
As of 2019Q4, total employment for the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time was 31,488 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2019Q4, employment declined 0.4% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q4.

Wage Trends

The average worker in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time earned annual wages of \$35,102 as of 2019Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 1.1% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$57,413 in the nation as of 2019Q4.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q2 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q4.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 21.7% lower in Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time than the U.S. average.

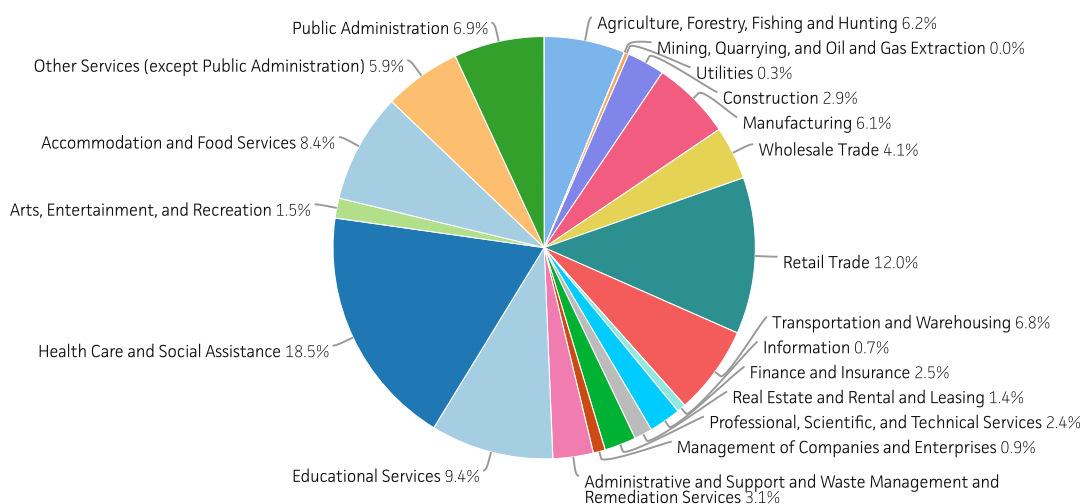

Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time is Health Care and Social Assistance, employing 5,826 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (3,776 workers) and Educational Services (2,963). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (LQ = 4.66), Transportation and Warehousing (1.49), and Public Administration (1.48).

Sectors in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$56,190), Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (\$56,178), and Wholesale Trade (\$55,657). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Health Care and Social Assistance (+110 jobs), Management of Companies and Enterprises (+84), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (+46).

Over the next 1 year, employment in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time is projected to contract by 539 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a -0.4% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (0 jobs), Utilities (-2), and Management of Companies and Enterprises (-5).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 4,109 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (3,233 workers) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (2,879). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 4.73), Education, Training, and Library Occupations (1.35), and Personal Care and Service Occupations (1.34).

Occupation groups in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time with the highest average wages per worker are Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$67,800), Management Occupations (\$65,400), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$64,900). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 2.5% among Legal Occupations to 16.3% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time is expected to be Personal Care and Service Occupations with a -0.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Community and Social Service Occupations (-2 jobs) and Legal Occupations (-2). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Sales and Related Occupations (428 jobs) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (414).

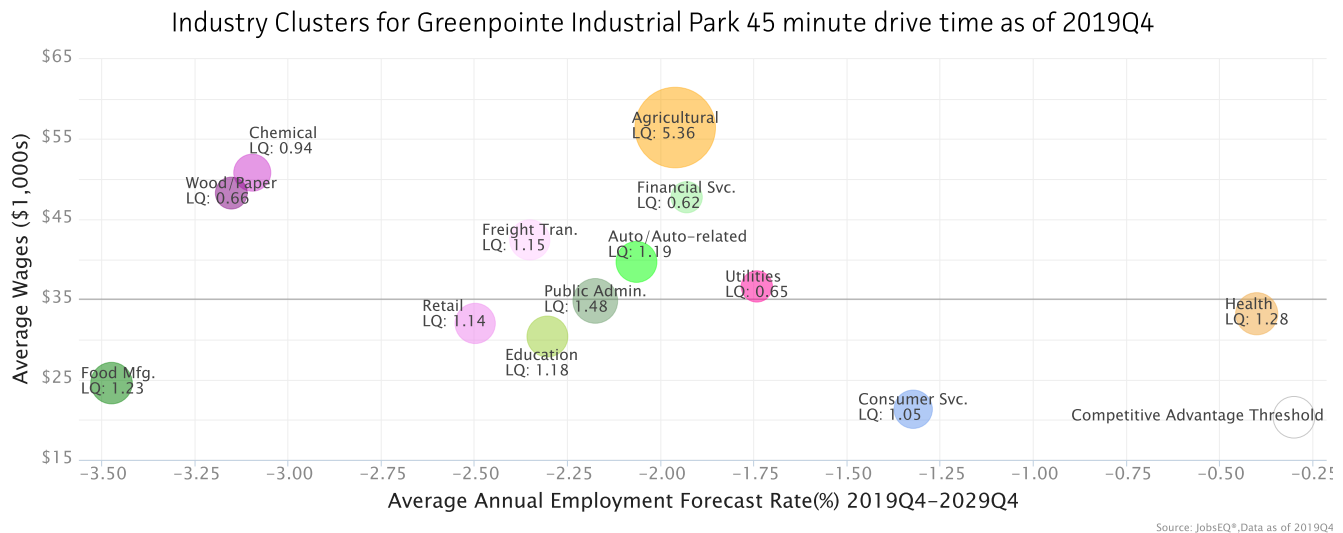

Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Greenpoint Industrial Park 45 minute drive time with the highest relative concentration is Agricultural with a location quotient of 5.36. This cluster employs 2,338 workers in the region with an average wage of \$56,445. Employment in the Agricultural cluster is projected to contract in the region about 2.0% per year over the next ten years.

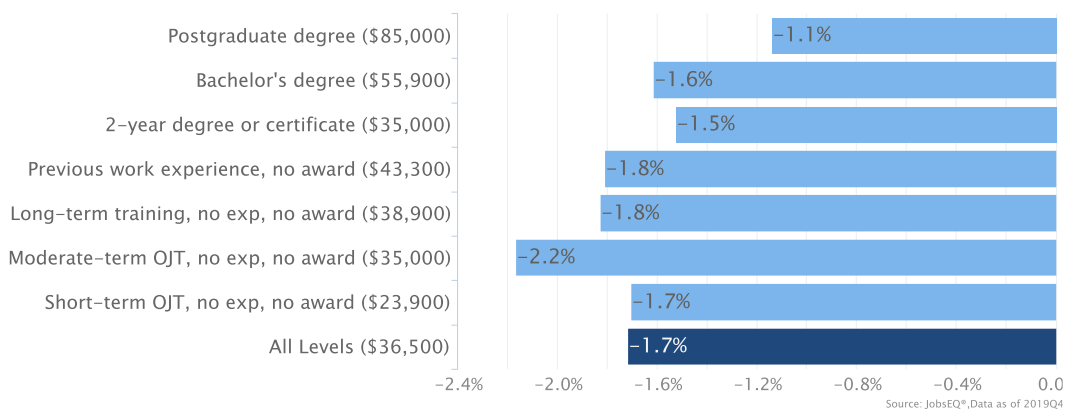

Education Levels

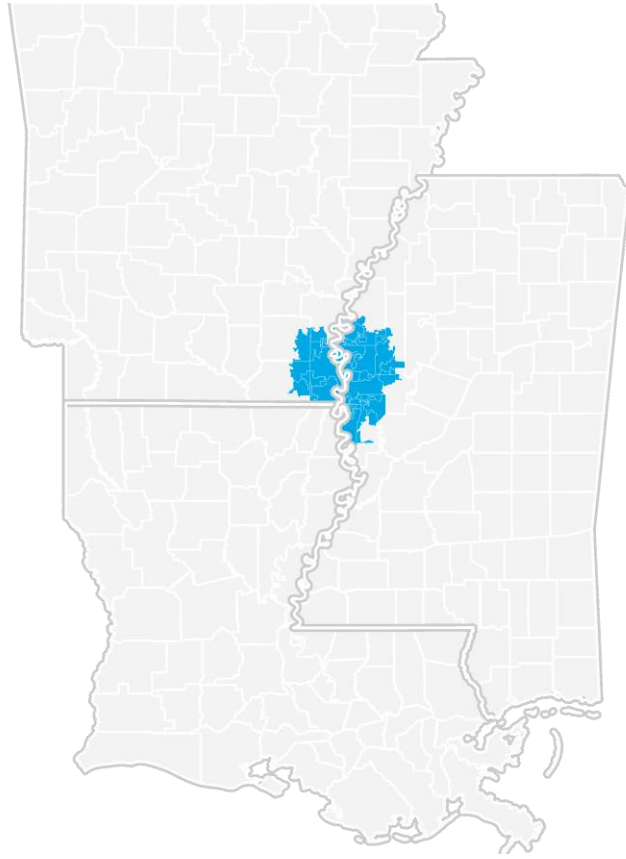
Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Greenpointe Industrial Park 45 minute drive time is projected to contract 1.7% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to contract 1.1% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 1.6% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to contract 1.5% per year.

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the “all industry” level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the “sector,” which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 820 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 23 major groups, 96 minor groups, and 449 occupation groups.
