Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level)

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Demographic Profile

The population in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) was 510,691 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020.

The region has a civilian labor force of 239,237 with a participation rate of 59.5%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level), 25.3% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation.

The median household income in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) is \$51,261 and the median house value is \$126,455.



Employment Trends


As of 2022Q1, total employment for the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) was 208,552 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2022Q1, employment increased 2.8% in the region.

Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) was 3.3% as of August 2022. The regional unemployment rate was lower than the national rate of 3.8%. One year earlier, in August 2021, the unemployment rate in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) was 5.0%.



Wage Trends

The average worker in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) earned annual wages of \$43,805 as of 2022Q1. Average annual wages per worker increased 6.8% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$66,637 in the nation as of 2022Q1.





Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2021Q4 with preliminary estimates updated to 2022Q1.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 18.4% lower in Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) is Health Care and Social Assistance, employing 32,556 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Manufacturing (26,836 workers) and Retail Trade (26,628). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (LQ = 1.83), Manufacturing (1.59), and Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (1.56).

Sectors in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$100,412), Utilities (\$76,063), and Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$74,259). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (+1,414 jobs), Construction (+662), and Accommodation and Food Services (+578).

Over the next 1 year, employment in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) is projected to expand by 671 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation with a +3.4% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Accommodation and Food Services (+357 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+243), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+70).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 23,530 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (22,151 workers) and Sales and Related Occupations (21,515). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Production Occupations (LQ = 1.57), Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (1.22), and Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (1.21).

Occupation groups in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) with the highest average wages per worker are Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$76,600), Legal Occupations (\$76,500), and Management Occupations (\$76,100). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.3% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 8.9% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) is expected to be Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations with a +1.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+295 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+107). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (3,344 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (2,866).



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) with the highest relative concentration is Food Mfg. with a location quotient of 4.75. This cluster employs 11,725 workers in the region with an average wage of \$35,887. Employment in the Food Mfg. cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.1% per year over the next ten years.



Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) is projected to grow 0.3% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.8% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.5% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.5% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Training Required

Gross Domestic Product


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2021, nominal GDP in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) expanded 9.1%. This follows a contraction of 0.0% in 2020. As of 2021, total GDP in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level) was \$20,094,859,000.



1 year % Change in GDP



Of the sectors in the Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time (County Level), Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2021, \$2,892,332,000 The next-largest contributions came from Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$2,636,461,000); Health Care and Social Assistance (\$2,500,177,000); and Retail Trade (\$1,992,419,000).

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
