AREA PROFILE

The Taylorsville Industrial Site 45 minute drive-time region is defined as the counties of Rankin, Scott, Simpson, Smith, Jasper, Lawrence, Jefferson Davis, Covington, Jones, Wayne, Lamar, and Forrest.

Within this region, approximately **78,146** people have monthly earnings of between **\$1,251 to \$3,333**.

53.6% of the workers in this earnings bracket are between the ages of **30 and 54 years**. **25.4%** are age **29 or younger**, and **21.0%** are age **55 or older** (table 1).

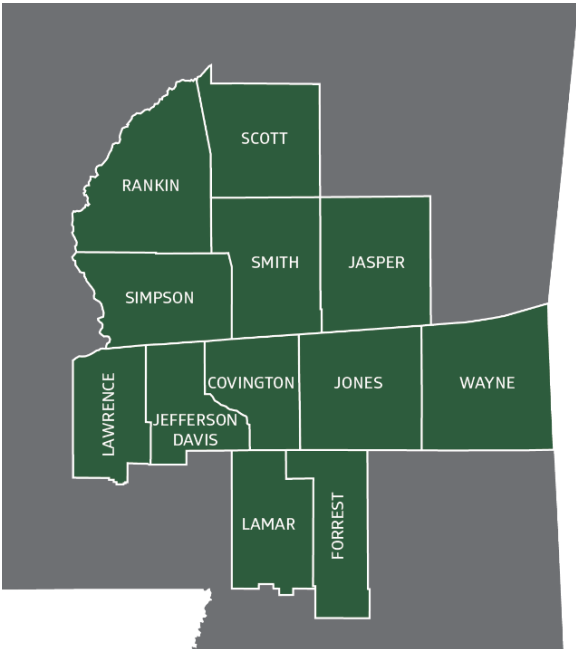

Within this region and earnings bracket, **16.4%** are employed in **Manufacturing**, 19.6% in Health Care and Social Assistance, and 15.1% in Retail Trade. The remaining industries all employ less than 10% of these workers (table 2).

COMMUTING PATTERNS

A majority of the workers in this earnings bracket live less than 10 miles from work. **25.6%** live **10-24 miles** from work, and **20.8%** live **greater than 50 miles** from work (table 3).

The largest amount of workers in this earnings bracket live in the **City of Hattiesburg**, followed by the Capital City of Jackson, Laurel, Pearl, Brandon, and Petal, Mississippi (table 4).
