

AREA PROFILE

The Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time region is defined as the counties of Jones, Wayne, Lamar, Forrest, Perry, Greene, Stone, George, Harrison, Jackson, Mobile (AL), and Washington (AL) counties.

Within this region, approximately **152,584** people have monthly earnings of between **\$1,251** to **\$3,333**.

53% of the workers in this earnings bracket are between the ages of **30 and 54 years**. **25.4%** are age **29 or younger**, and **21.2%** are age **55 or older** (table 1).

Within this region and earnings bracket, 15.7% are employed in Retail Trade, 18.7% in Health Care and Social Assistance, and 13.3% in Accommodation and Food Services. The remaining industries all employ less than 10% of these workers (table 2).

COMMUTING PATTERNS

A majority of the workers in this earnings bracket live less than 10 miles from work. **24.5%** live **10-24 miles** from work, and nearly **15.6%** live **greater than 50 miles** from work (table 3).

The largest amount of workers in this earnings bracket live in the **City of Mobile, Alabama**, followed by the cities of Gulfport, MS, Biloxi, MS, Hattiesburg, MS, Prichard, AL, and Pascagoula, MS (table 4).


