The population in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) was 500,346 per American Community Survey data for 2018-2022.

The region has a civilian labor force of 227,172 with a participation rate of 58.3%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County), 24.6% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 36.5% in the nation.



Employment Trends







Wage Trends

The average worker in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) earned annual wages of \$50,137 as of 2024Q4. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.8% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$73,145 in the nation as of 2024Q4.

Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) is Health Care and Social Assistance, employing 35,915 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Accommodation and Food Services (33,478 workers) and Retail Trade (24,361). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Accommodation and Food Services (LQ = 1.83), Utilities (1.79), and Manufacturing (1.38).

Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Health Care and Social Assistance (+2,771 jobs), Retail Trade (+986), and Manufacturing (+558).

Over the next 1 year, employment in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) is projected to expand by 287 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services with a +0.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+187 jobs), Accommodation and Food Services (+86), and Construction (+41).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) is Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, employing 24,200 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (23,103 workers) and Sales and Related Occupations (18,779). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (LQ = 1.40), Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (1.38), and Personal Care and Service Occupations (1.38).

Occupation groups in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$99,900), Legal Occupations (\$92,700), and Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$92,000). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.0% among Legal Occupations to 6.7% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +0.9% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+89 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+74). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (4,598 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (2,592).





Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) with the highest relative concentration is Machinery Mfg. with a location quotient of 3.42. This cluster employs 12,877 workers in the region with an average wage of \$86,295. Employment in the Machinery Mfg. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.1% per year over the next ten years.





Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in the Greene County Rail Site 45 minute drive-time (County) is projected to grow 0.1% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.4% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.4% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.4% per year.

Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels





FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
